Dual Credit Overview

What is Dual Credit? A system under which an eligible high school student enrolls in college course(s) and receives credit for the course(s) from both the college and the high school.

What courses are eligible?

- 1) Those in the <u>core curriculum</u> of the public institution of higher education providing the credit;
- 2) a career and technical education course; or
- 3) a foreign language course.



^{*}No developmental education or remedial courses can be offered for dual credit.

Dual Credit Overview (cont.)

Exception

Any course that is required to complete an Early College program...

 Any college course for dual credit offered as part of an early college program must be a core curriculum course of the public institution of higher education providing the credit, a career and technical education course, a foreign language course, or course that satisfies specific degree plan requirements leading to the completion of a Board approved certificate, AA, AS, AAS degree program, or FOS.



Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC)



- Provides oversight of all higher education programs and courses that may be offered under different names such as "early college," "dual credit," or "concurrent enrollment."
- SPC is required to document and identify high schools that offer 25-49%, then more than 50%, of a degree program.



SACSCOC 10-Year Reaccreditation Process

- On-site review scheduled for September 18th 21st, 2023.
- All high schools which offer dual credit, are considered an off-campus instructional site.
- The site visit team will review instructor CVs and credentialing materials, course syllabi, etc.
- High school visits will be scheduled in July. Preparation meetings will be scheduled accordingly, before the on-site time arrives in September.



Dual Credit – Instructional Requirements

Curriculum

- The college must ensure that a dual credit course and the corresponding course offered at the main campus of the college are equivalent with respect to curriculum, materials, instruction, and method/rigor of student evaluation.
- "A college course is a college course, regardless of where, how, and to whom it is offered."

<u>Faculty</u>

- Faculty must meet the same standards and approval procedures used by the college to select faculty responsible for teaching the same courses at the main campus of the college.
- The college shall supervise and evaluate instructors of dual credit courses using the same procedures used for faculty at the main campus of the college.
- The instructor of record actually teaches the course not in name only, nor a graduate assistant.
 Faculty roster forms are submitted to SACS for review during re-accreditation process.



Dual Credit – Credentialing

Who is eligible to teach?

<u>Academic Transfer</u> – Master's degree with at least 18 graduate hours in the teaching discipline.

<u>Career and Technical Education</u> – Either a bachelor's degree in the teaching discipline or an associate's degree with <u>demonstrated competencies</u> in the discipline.



Career and Technical Education Update

Articulated Credit vs. Dual Credit

- Cost
- Immediately Transcripted
- Transferable

Summer Workshops and On-Campus Training

- During workshops, technical program coordinators and faculty provide teachers a list of sequential courses, which will count toward program certificate/degree.
- Technical program coordinators and faculty provide course content for every course that an instructor has been approved to teach, in order to guarantee course equivalency.
- Dual Credit instructors **must** teach college-level material and cover all required content, preparing students for more advanced courses, following high school graduation.

New outcome metric – students who complete at least 15 SCH in dual credit courses

Financial Aid for Swift Transfer (FAST) – new financial aid program that would allow "educationally disadvantaged" students to enroll in dual credit classes at no cost to them.

Dual Credit Eligibility

Student Eligibility

Demonstration of college readiness via TSIA or through an exemption.

- ACT
- SAT
- Algebra II STAAR EOC
- English III STAAR EOC

Other option – use a waiver to satisfy dual credit eligibility requirements (not college readiness)

- English II STAAR EOC
- Algebra I STAAR EOC (plus passing grade in Algebra II course)
- PSAT/NMSQT

Not required for dual credit courses contained in a Workforce Education Level 1 Certificate. *College Prep Waiver/Texas College Bridge cannot be used by students while in high school.

Recent College Readiness Changes

TSI English Language Arts & Reading (ELAR) required -

All college-level ENGL courses;

BIOL 1406, 1407, 1411, 1413, 1414, 2401, 2404, 2420;

*Not BIOL 1408 & 1409 (Biology for Non-Science Majors)

Required for admission into certain restricted programs – e.g., EMS

TSI Mathematics required -

All college-level MATH courses;

BIOL 2401 (A&P I) & 2420 (Microbiology)

Courses that are no longer restricted -

All ANTH, ARTS, BCIS, CHEM, GOVT, HIST, HUMA, MUSI, PSYC, SOCI, SPCH - will no longer require demonstration of college readiness (they will all be TSI non-liable courses).

Ex) Completion of college-level math or CHEM-1406 before enrolling in CHEM-1411; Pass TSI ELAR before enrolling in EDUC-1301 (Intro to the Teaching Profession).



Registration Steps

- 1. Complete an Online Admission Application (apply.southplainscollege.edu)
- Students Consult High School Counselor
 Students receive an enrollment form to submit to the dual credit office or are included on the district's enrollment spreadsheet.
- 3. Submit High School Transcripts
- 4. Testing/Score Documentation (as needed).

Testing Reminders

- Please make sure students complete the PAA this is a state requirement.
- No electronics in the testing space no phones, smart watches or calculators.
- Please do not start or stop tests for students...
- Please include all diagnostic scores, when submitting testing documentation students can still become college ready, if diagnostic scores are high enough!

Degree Requirements (cont.)

Difference between the Associate of Arts & Associate of Science?

Associate of Science requires an additional Mathematics course (for 6 total hours) and eight hours of Lab Sciences (traditionally designed for STEM majors).

The Associate of Science degree only allows 11 hours of elective credit – normally reserved for advanced math or science coursework.

Academic Suspension and Probation Policy

Dual Credit Students will be placed on Academic Probation at the end of any term that they do not earn a minimum of 2.00 cumulative GPA.

Students will then have a registration hold placed on their account.

What should Dual Credit students do that have a probation hold?

- Contact their high school counselor;
- Complete a Dual Credit Academic Probation Packet (on the SPC Dual Credit webpage)
- Schedule a conference call between student, counselor and staff member from the Dual Credit Office for advisement, hold removal and enrollment.

Disability Services

- Whether the student is taking the course in their own high school classroom, online, or at an SPC campus, the student must disclose their diagnosed disability(ies) to Disability Services in order to receive classroom accommodations.
- A school counselor or representative may assist students in completing an accommodations application and submitting all required documentation through the AIM portal on the Disability Services webpage – reminder: all documents MUST be signed and dated by the student.
- The dual credit student requesting accommodations is required to meet with Disability Services, in order to receive reasonable accommodations that are established for the student wanting to take college-level coursework.
- Keep in mind in college-level courses, <u>curriculum cannot be modified</u> for students with disabilities. Dual Credit students are expected to demonstrate the same level of understanding of all course material and meet the same minimum skill performance standards as every other student in the college class. High school IEPs and 504 plans cannot be applied at the college level...




- Available after the census date of each term (e.g., September 13th for Fall 2023) to view your dual credit students' course averages and participation.
- Your high school login credentials will be provided to you by the Dual Credit Office.
- You will receive a "back-door" link to access Blackboard Observer after the census date for each term.
- Please check regularly to ensure student interventions are accomplished in a timely manner and whether refunds or drop options are still available.
- If you assign this task to your facilitators, we encourage them to report to you on a weekly basis.







Early Alert Process

- SPC Faculty voluntarily report information for students who have missed due dates, are behind on assignments, or have not completed exams.
- Dual Credit Academic Advisors will reach out to students once alerts are reported to the Dual Credit office.
- Dual Credit staff will simultaneously reach out to the appropriate counselor and/or coordinator, when they contact students directly.

Important Dates

August 28th - First day of class.

(Blackboard will be made available to students Thursday, August 24th).

September 1st - Last day to add an ITV or online class.

(End of the first week of class).

September 5th – Dual credit payment deadline.

September 13th - The12th class day; serves as the College's official census date.

(Last day to enroll in a dual credit course that's being offered at a high school Location).

For students who register before August 28th - payment is due no later than close of business on August 28th.

For students who register after August 28th - payment will be due that same day of registration.



Last Year in Review

Over 2,600 students enrolled in dual credit coursework this Spring semester – more than 500 of those students were enrolled in CTE dual credit courses.

Honor Cords (awarded for completing 24 Dual Credit hours with SPC)

- SPC had 381 students receive dual credit honor cords in May 2023.

Associate Degree Completers

- More than 45 dual credit students will receive their Associate degrees for the 22-23 AY.
