**Course Description:** This course is designed for those students who need MATH 0314 or MATH 0324 and did not score a minimum of 340 on the TSIA. It includes properties of signed numbers, algebraic expressions, linear equations in one unknown and geometry. Time in a math lab is required. This course will not satisfy graduation requirements. The course is required if testing indicates a need.

**Prerequisite:** Maximum score of 339 on TSIA without an ABE score or a successful completion of NCBM 0105.

- 2. Use the order of operations to simplify an expression.
- 3. Simplify algebraic expressions.
- 4. Solve linear equations.
- 5. Translate and solve word problems.
- 6. Solve linear inequalities.
- 7. Graph equations in two variables by the intercept method and the slope intercept method.
- 8. Evaluate expressions using exponent rules.
- 9. Add, subtract, multiply and divide polynomials.
- 10. Factor polynomials.
- 11. Solve quadratic equations by factoring.

**Homework:** Homework will be assigned online through MyStatLab: <u>www.pearson.com/mylab</u>. Students can access from SPC Blackboard. Typically the online homework assignments are due at 11:59 pm on Sunday of every week, and allow up to 5 attempts per problem. <u>The due</u> <u>date of homework will not be extended, so please check the due date often</u>.

**<u>Quizzes</u>**: Quizzes will be given weekly and they will be similar to the questions assigned as homework and problems solved in regular class period. No make-up quizzes will be allowed.

**Exams:** Exams must be taken in pencil during the regular class period. Students are not allowed to leave the examination room until they have turned in their test for grading.

**<u>Final</u>**: The comprehensive final will be given on **Tuesday**, **December 8**<sup>th</sup> (7:45 pm – 9:45 pm) as directed by the official South Plains College Schedule. <u>No make-up final will be given</u>. The final exam will be comprehensive and cover all material covered in class duing the semester.

**Make-up:** Make-up work is given at the discretion of the instructor. <u>NO make-up exams are</u> given without prior notification AND proper documentation. If are absent from class, have given prior notification and proper documentation of your absence, you MUST make arrangements to take the quiz or exam BEFORE the next class period.
